



YAKAMA NATION
SCIENTIFIC COLLECTOR'S PERMIT

1. This Scientific Collector's Permit is issued by authority of the Yakama Nation pursuant to its status as a self-regulatory manager of fish and wildlife resources.
2. The undersigned agencies, entities, or persons are authorized to take fish and wildlife species listed below for scientific purposes only, subject to the conditions of this permit.
3. This permit is non-transferable. Agencies, entities, or persons not listed on this permit may not collect fish and wildlife species under authority of this permit.
4. A report of take must be completed and returned to the tribal Fisheries Resource Management Program at termination of sampling activities.

CONDITIONS:

Location, species and number to be taken: Lower Columbia River Hydro Projects, Bonneville (up to 1,000), The Dalles (up to 750), and John Day (up to 750) and up to 1,000 from Priest Rapids and Wells; Species - Pacific Lamprey; in total up to 2,500 adults from Lower Columbia and up to 1,000 adults from Upper Columbia. The precise allocation number for Lower Columbia will be announced in spring 2020 by CRITFC.

Purpose of collection: Primarily for translocation, but some for artificial propagation, passage studies, and other restoration and critical research needs within ceded lands. Some collection may be from during fish ladder dewatering.


Disposition of catch: Once adults are transferred to aerated fish totes, they will be transported either to the translocation streams/ivers directly or to Prosser Hatchery prior to translocation release or propagation (unless a specific need exists to transfer the fish to an alternative facility). Most of these lamprey will be released in the Yakima (up to 1,000), Wenatchee (up to 500), Methow (up to 500), Klickitat (up to 250), Okanogan subbasins (up to 250), or mainstem Columbia River further up river (up to 1,000). Some may be transferred to CTUIR who lost all of their translocated adults from flooding.

Agency, entity, or persons authorized to take fish and wildlife under this permit: Yakama Nation Fisheries Resource Management Program, Pacific Lamprey Project (Ralph Lampman, Tyler Beals, Dave'y Lumley, Sean Goudy, Shekinah Saluskin, & other crew members). CRITFC staff (as translocation partner).

Dates or duration of sampling activities (not to exceed current year): May 1, 2020 to April 30, 2021
