

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD: 17 LGS 10 Emergency Debris Spill**SUBJECT:** Emergency Debris Spill

Debris in Little Goose forebay continues to accumulate in front of spillways and the powerhouse. Lower Granite has conducted multiple debris spill operations as they continue to see debris moving down the Snake River. On June 6, from 1442-1635 hours, emergency debris spill operations were implemented at Little Goose through the temporary spillway weir (spillway 1) and also spillway 2 as described in the Fish Passage Plan (LGS-28 5.1.3). An estimated 2 acres of woody debris was removed from the immediate forebay. Spill and unit operations deviated from the Fish Passage Plan during the emergency spill.
